

4. Spiritual Administration

1. A spiritual administrator is a priest or other designated SEU employee who is entrusted with the spiritual care of the students and staff of the university. The spiritual administrator is appointed by the Archbishop of Bratislava, in the case of a religious, on the proposal or at least with the consent of the competent superior (canons 565 and 682), or by the rector of the university.
2. The Spiritual Administrator represents the UPC in all legal matters according to the norm of law and sees that the property of the UPC is administered according to the norm of Canons 1281-1288.
3. It may act against third parties (students, sponsors) only in matters that are related to the mission of the UPC and are defined by statute.
4. The Spiritual Administrator shall be responsible for compliance with generally applicable legal ecclesiastical and state standards within the scope of his/her authority.
5. The Spiritual Administrator is responsible for the space set aside in the dormitories for UPC activities and for the property taken into temporary management.
6. The UPC Spiritual Administrator is assisted by: diocesan priests and religious who have a relationship with the SEU youth and also by lay persons in the role of pastoral assistants.

5. Management

1. UPC is economically administered by the SEU's Economics Department.
2. The SEU's economics department oversees the protection of UPC's assets so that they do not suffer damage.
3. Representatives from the SEU's Economics Department are present for the handover and acceptance of UPC's asset management.
4. Members of the Economics Department of the SEU are to maintain confidentiality, except for matters that are recognized as disclosable. The obligation of confidentiality shall remain in force after the termination of employment with the SEU.
5. All members of the Economics Department of the SEU perform their service free of charge.
6. The Rector has the right to control the activities of the Economic Department of the SEU.
7. All UPC monies are to be deposited in a cash depository or cashier's office and evidence thereof carefully preserved in the archives of the SEU's Economics Department.
8. In employment relations, the spiritual administrator is governed by the legislation in force.

6. Dissolution and termination

1. The decision to dissolve the UPC is made jointly by the President of the SEU and the ABU.
2. The dissolution of UPC transfers all of its assets to the university.

7. Final provision

1. The status of the UPC is subject to the oversight and governance of the competent ecclesiastical and academic hierarchy according to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and secular legislation.
2. UPC is politically independent.
3. UPC is governed by the legal norms in force in the Slovak Republic in the performance of its activities and the implementation of its objectives.
4. The UPC statute, its recognition or change, is subject to the approval of the Chancellor of the SEU on whose premises the UPC is located.
